1873: Jacob Zeisset born in Kreuzfeld to Jakob Zeisset and Margaretha Mueller 1876: Christina Bohnenblust born at Alida, Kansas to John Bohnenblust and Maria Rickli 1881: Margaretha Mueller dies in Kreuzfeld 1884: Jakob Zeisset dies in Schwäbisch Hall Jake and Lizzie go to live with Uncle Isaak Zeisset in Eichenau, Germany 1887: Confirmed at Lendsiedel, the church serving Eichenau 1888: Moved with Isaak Zeisset family to Darstadt, Germany in February 1890: Jakob Zeisset arrives in New York City, from Bremen on SS EMS in February May have lived briefly with John and Louise Swart 1893: Henry Zeisset arrives from Germany 1895: Living with and working for M. H. Russell on farm later owned by Herman 1896: Jake marries Christina Bohnenblust in Riley, Kansas Possibly lived on farm 1 mile north and 1 mile west of west edge of Leonardville Emma is born 1898: Bettie is born 1899: George is born 1903: Earl is born 1907: Nellie is born 1910: Jake and Christina have rented a farm 2 miles west and 3 miles south of

Leonardville

1911: Arnold is born and dies in a week 1913: Sophia is born and dies in 3 days

Roman is born

1915: Jacob is born

1915: The farm has now been purchased by Jake and Christina

1916: Bettie marries Gilbert Olson in January in Manhattan Emma marries Martin Hageman in Riley in March

1923: George marries Margaret Crowl in Leonardville

1925: Ludwig Hoerman has purchased part of Jake's farm

1927: Nellie marries Ernest Lindquist in Waterville, Kansas

1928: Earl marries Helen White at Stockdale, Kansas

After 1930: Jake loses the farm

Bef. 1940: Roman marries Dorothy Buseman

1940: Jacob marries Fern Davidson in Manhattan, Kansas

1950: Christina dies in Leonardville1952: Jake dies in Waterville, Kansas
